



- 1– What is the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary?
 - 2– What is a good response for those who do not understand a devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary?
 - 3– Why is the Immaculate Heart of Mary shown as a human heart pierced with a sword and encircled with roses?
- Bonus: Why should we consecrate our family to the Immaculate Heart of Mary?

Answers:

1– The Immaculate Heart of Mary signifies the great purity and love of the heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary for God. Mary's Immaculate Heart points us to her profound interior life, where she experienced both joys and sorrows, and remained faithful, as we, too, are called to do.

2—"Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did." St. Maximilian Kolbe

3– The heart is pierced with a sword "so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too." (Luke :35) roses are known as the "queen of flowers" and symbolize Mary as Queen of Heaven, they also depict hidden suffering in their thorny stems and are a connection to Jesus' crown of thorns.

Bonus: The act of Family Consecration is a deliberate choice to follow Jesus Christ more fully, with the help of Mary and Joseph, and to set your family apart for God. This allows grace to flow into our homes as we build virtue through love.
